#### **TOWNSHIP OF THE ARCHIPELAGO**

BY-LAW NO. 2022-29

A By-law to regulate noise within the Township of The Archipelago and to repeal By-law 07-19, as amended.

**WHEREAS** Section 129, of *The Municipal Act*, 2001, S.O. c. 25, provides authority for municipalities to prohibit and regulate noise and vibration;

**AND WHEREAS** The Council of the Corporation of the Township of The Archipelago deems it necessary to regulate or prohibit noise within the Township of The Archipelago;

**AND WHEREAS** Section 436 of the Ontario Municipal Act, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, authorizes a municipality to pass by-laws providing that the municipality may enter on land for the purpose of carrying out inspections, to determine compliance with a by-law, direction, order, or condition of licence;

**AND WHEREAS** Section 391 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, authorizes Council to pass by-laws imposing fees or charges on any class of persons for services or activities provided or done by or on behalf of it, and for costs payable by it for services or activities provided or done by or on behalf of any other municipality, or local board;

**AND WHEREAS** Section 429, subject to subsection (4), of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, provides that a municipality may establish a system of fines for offences under a by-law of the municipality passed under this Act;

**AND WHEREAS** Section 446 of the Ontario Municipal Act, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, provides that, where a municipality directs or requires by by-law or otherwise that a matter or thing be done, in default of it being done by the person directed or required to do it, such matter or thing may be done at the person's expense, and that the municipality may recover the cost of doing such thing or matter by action or by adding the costs to the tax roll and collecting them in the same manner as property taxes;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of The Archipelago enacts as follows:

#### 1.0 **DEFINITIONS**

For the purposes of this By-law the following definitions shall apply;

#### Construction

"construction" includes erection, alteration, repair, dismantling, demolition, structural maintenance, painting, moving, land clearing, earthmoving, grading, excavating, the laying of pipe and conduit whether above or below ground level, street and highway building, concreting, equipment installation and alteration and the structural installation of construction components and materials in any form or for any purpose, and includes any work in connection therewith;

Construction Equipment

"construction equipment" means any equipment or device designed and intended for use in construction, or material handling, including but not limited to, air compressors, pile drivers, pneumatic or hydraulic tools, bulldozers, tractors, excavators, trenchers, cranes, derricks, loaders, scrapers, pavers, generators, off highway haulers or trucks, ditchers, compactors and rollers, pumps, concrete mixers, graders, or other material handling equipment;

#### Conveyance

"conveyance" includes a vehicle and any other device employed to transport a person or persons or goods from place to place but does not include any such device or vehicle if operated only within the dwelling of a person;

#### Council

"Council" means the Council of the Corporation of the Township of The Archipelago;

#### **Electronic Device**

"electronic device" means a device intended primarily for the production, reproduction or amplification of sound, including, but not limited to, any musical instrument, radio receiver, television receiver, recorder, phonograph, loudspeakers, amplifiers, microphones or reproducers or any combination of such equipment, including devices used in the reproduction of music, speech or other sounds;

#### **Highway**

"highway" includes a common and public highway, street, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct or trestle designed and intended for, or used by, the general public for the passage of vehicles;

#### Motor Vehicle

"motor vehicle" includes an automobile, motorcycle, a motorized snow vehicle and any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power; but does not include the cars of electric or steam railways, or other motor vehicles running only upon rails, or traction engine, farm tractor, self propelled implement of husbandry or road building machine within the meaning of the Highway Traffic Act:

#### **Motorized Conveyance**

"motorized conveyance" means a conveyance propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular, gravitational or wind power;

#### Municipality

"municipality" means the land within the geographic limit of the Corporation of the Township of The Archipelago;

#### **Noise**

"noise" means sound at the *point of reception* that is of such volume or nature that it is likely to disturb the inhabitants of the municipality;

#### Officer

"officer" means a Municipal Law Enforcement Officer, a Police Officer or any other person designated by Council as responsible for the administration of this by-law from time to time;

#### Owner

"owner" includes with respect to land or Property, the registered owner, occupant, tenant, or the person for the time managing or receiving the rent of the property whether on his own account or on account of an agent or trustee of any other person, or any of the aforesaid;

#### Person

"person" includes an individual, an Owner, corporation, partnership, company, firm, association, or party and includes the successors, assigns, heirs, executors, administrators, or other legal representatives of a person to who the context can apply according to law and the singular shall include the plural;

#### Point of Reception

"point of reception" means any point on the premises of a person where sound originating from other than those premises is received;

#### **Premise**

"premise" means any physical piece of land located geographically within the municipality being used, owned or occupied by any person at any time and the plural shall have the corresponding meaning;

#### Racing

"racing" means any manner of driving that occurs to a degree or in a fashion that constitutes a marked departure from the standards of the norm:

#### Set Fine

"set fine" means a monetary penalty that can be issued to a person or corporation found in violation of the provisions of this by-law, established by by-laws passed by the Township, the *Provincial Offences Act*, R.S.O. 1990 or the *Municipal Act*, 2001.

#### 2.0 GENERAL PROHIBITIONS

- 2.1 No *person* shall make cause or permit the emission of *noise* which disturbs or is likely to disturb the quiet piece rest enjoyment comfort or convenience of the inhabitants of the Township of The Archipelago.
- 2.2 No *person* shall emit or cause or permit the emission of *noise* resulting from an act listed in Schedule "A" General Prohibitions, attached hereto, and which *noise* is clearly audible at a *point of reception*.

#### 3.0 PROHIBITIONS BY TIME

- 3.1 No *person* shall make cause or permit the emission of *noise* which disturbs or is likely to disturb the quiet piece rest enjoyment comfort or convenience of the inhabitants of the Township of The Archipelago.
- 3.2 No *person* or *owner* shall emit, cause, or permit the emission of excessive *noise*, which disrupts the normal living or working environment of a person at a *point of reception*, resulting from an act or emanating from a device listed in Schedule "B" attached hereto this By-law.

#### 4.0 EXEMPTION

- 4.1 This By-law does not apply:
  - a) during an emergency involving the health, safety or welfare of the public;
  - b) to the operation of snow plowing or snow removal equipment on public or private property;
  - c) to community event(s);
  - d) to any *person* who is granted an exemption under Section 5 of this By-law by Council provided all terms and conditions set by Council are met for the period of time set out in the exemption granted;
  - e) the use of church bells or chimes normally associated with church activities.

#### 5.0 GRANT OF EXEMPTION BY COUNCIL

#### 5.1 Application to Council

Notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, any person may make application to Council to be granted an exemption from any of the provisions of this by-law with respect to any *noise* for which they might be prosecuted.

5.2 An application for a noise exemption under Section 5.1 shall be filed with the Clerk and submitted on an application in the form prescribed by Schedule "D".

#### 6.0 RIGHT OF ENTRY

- 6.1 An Officer may enter at all reasonable times upon any premises or property to ascertain whether the provisions of this By-law are obeyed and to enforce and carry into effect the provisions of this By-law.
- 6.2 An *Officer* must upon request, display or produce proper identification in the form of the appointment resolution from *council*.

#### 7.0 OBSTRUCTION

- 7.1 No person shall hinder or obstruct, or attempt to hinder or obstruct, any *Officer* exercising a power or performing a duty under this Bylaw.
- 7.2 Any person, who has been alleged to have contravened any of the provisions of this By-law, shall identify himself or herself to the *Officer* upon request. Failure to do so shall be deemed to have obstructed or hindered the *Officer* in the execution of his or her duties.

#### 8.0 PENALTY

8.1 Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law is guilty of an offence and on conviction is liable to the *set fines* and other penalties prescribed by the *Provincial Offences Act* R.S.O. 1990, c. 33, as amended. The applicable minimum fines for a first offense are identified on Schedule "C" of this Bylaw.

#### 9.0 RECOVERY OF COSTS

- In addition to any fines or penalties established elsewhere in accordance with this By-law, the person(s) responsible for the site, at the time of the violation, and therein allowing or creating the noise violation, or permitting it to happen, and/or the absentee property owners shall be liable to the Township by way of a fee or charge, as calculated in accordance with Schedule "E" to this By-law, including those costs and expenses incurred by the Township including (9.1.1 and 9.1.2).
- 9.2 Investigating and responding to a complaint made to the Township, or a Bylaw enforcement Officer by any person acting reasonably and in good faith, which resulted in causing or have caused actual discomfort to the complainant, or was in violation of a By-law and therein resulted in.
- 9.3 The dispatching of an Officer, and/or other agencies, their vehicles or equipment and and/or emergency support personnel for the purpose of: investigating a noise complaint and/or initiating the controlling or validating that the onsite situation, was in violation of this Noise By-law.
- 9.4 All fees and charges payable under this By-law, Section 9.1 are due and owing to the Township within thirty (30) days of the date of an invoice rendered to the person liable to pay them.
- 9.5 All overdue accounts shall accrue interest at the rate of 1.25% per month (15% per annum), calculated monthly, from the due date until paid in full.
- 9.6 If a person who causes or allows noise content or levels contrary to this By-law is not the owner of the property but occupies or is using the property with the owner's consent, the owner and the person(s) on site- shall be jointly and severally liable to pay any fees and charges imposed by this By-law.
- 9.7 All fees and charges payable under this By-law constitute a debt of the person liable for payment of them to the Township and, in the case of owners of a property being responsible for payment of the fees and charges, the Township may add the amount owing to the tax roll for the owner(s) real property and collect them in like manner as municipal taxes.

#### 10.0 ADMINISTRATION OF THE BY-LAW

10.1 Municipal Law Enforcement / By-law Officers employed by the Township: and also Peace Officers who are part of but not limited to members of the Ontario Provincial Police, Ministry of Northern Development, Mines, Natural Resources, and Forestry, and any

- other provincial or federal government bodies are hereby authorized to enforce this By-law.
- 10.2 Where the singular is used, it shall also mean or stand for the plural.

#### 11.0 SHORT TITLE

11.1 The short title of this By-law is the "Noise By-law".

#### 12.0 SEVERABILITY

12.1 If a court of competent jurisdiction should declare any section or a part of this By-law to be invalid, the remainder of this By-law shall continue in force unless the court makes an order to the contrary.

#### 13.0 REPEAL OF PREVIOUS BY-LAWS

- 13.1 That By-law No. 07-19 as amended, is hereby repealed and any and all by-laws contrary hereto or inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.
- 13.2 Schedules "A", "B", "C", "D" and "E" attached hereto form part of this By-law.
- 13.3 That this By-law shall come into full force and effect on its date of passing.

#### SCHEDULE "A" TO BY-LAW NO. 2022-29

#### **GENERAL PROHIBITIONS**

- 1. Racing other than in a racing event regulated by law.
- 2. The operation of *motor vehicle* in such a way that the tires squeal.
- 3. The operation of any combustion engine or pneumatic device without an effective exhaust or intake muffling device in good working order and in constant operation.
- 4. The operation of a *motor vehicle* or a vehicle with a trailer resulting in banging, clanking, squealing or other like sounds due to improperly secured load or equipment, or inadequate maintenance.
- 5. The operation of an engine or motor in, or on, any *motor vehicle* or item of attached auxiliary equipment for a continuous period exceeding five minutes, while such vehicle is stationary, unless:
  - the original equipment manufacturer specifically recommends a longer idling period for normal and efficient operation of the motor vehicle in which case such recommended period shall not be exceeded; or,
  - b) operation of such engine or motor is essential to a basic function of the vehicle or equipment, including but not limited to, operation of ready-mixed concrete trucks and lift platforms; or,
  - c) weather conditions justify the use of heating or refrigerating systems powered by the motor or engine for the safety and welfare of the operator, passengers or animals, or the preservation of perishable cargo, and the vehicle is stationary for purposes of delivery or loading; or,
  - d) prevailing low temperatures make longer idling periods necessary immediately after starting the motor or engine; or,
  - e) the idling is for the purpose of cleaning and flushing the radiator and associated circulation system for seasonal change of antifreeze, cleaning of the fuel system, carburettor or the like, when such work is performed other than for profit.
- 6. The operation of a *motor vehicle* horn or other warning device except where required or authorized by law or in accordance with good safety practices.
- 7. The operation of any item of *construction equipment* without effective muffling devices in good working order and in constant operation and in accordance with the equipment manufacturer.
- 8. The operation of any wind energy or power system which produces *noise* at the *point of reception*.
- 9. The discharge of firearms, other than as part of an otherwise lawful hunt, gun club, or what such discharge has law enforcement or agricultural purposes.

- 10. Residential domestic activities that produce *noise* of such nature that is unwanted, on-going, persistent, unusual, repetitive, a public nuisance that disturbs a *person*.
- 11. The operation of a combustion engine which is, used in or is intended for use in, a toy or a model or replica of any device, which model or replica has no function other than amusement and which is not a conveyance.
- 12. Persistent barking, calling or whining or other similar persistent noise making by any domestic pet or any other animal kept or used for any purpose other than agriculture.
